Nick Fox is Professor of Clinical Neurology at UCL's Institute of Neurology where he is Director of the Dementia Research Centre and Joint Head of the Department of Neurodegeneration.

He is also a Group Leader and founder member of the UK Dementia Research Institute. He is active clinically as a Consultant Neurologist at the National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery where he runs a specialist cognitive clinic. He has clinical and research interests in young onset and familial dementias. He helped set up the first support groups for these disorders.

His research includes improving diagnosis and using imaging and biomarkers to accelerate the search for effective therapies. He is a member of the Alzheimer's Society Research Strategy Council and was a member of the Prime Minister's Dementia Research Champion's Group.

He has received a number of prizes and awards including the 2017 Weston Brain Institute International Outstanding Achievement Award and the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh Alexander Morison Medal for 2018. Sciences, and the American Philosophical Society.
